Twin girls Avery and Emily arrived several weeks early and were unable to breathe without respirators. Their mother, Karen Fox, says their condition was "touch and go." Fox and her husband, Aaron Million, credit the staff of Poudre Valley Hospital's neonatal intensive care unit with saving their daughters' lives.
